# **Exchange Reflections**

On January 28, 2015, seven members of FF Winnipeg, the Franzs, the Grovers, the Havixbecks and Dolly T., joined FF Lethbridge's Exchanges to Taichung and Kaohsiung, Taiwan. Also joining the group of 20 were 2 from FF Calgary and 2 from FF Medicine Hat.

Taiwan was an unknown to all of us but it did not disappoint. It has a pleasant climate, a rich history, beautiful natural scenery, well-priced culinary delights and interesting night markets. It was truly a cultural experience!



The numbers of scooters is mind-boggling! For instance, the population of Kaohsiung, located in SW Taiwan, is 2.77 million and it has over 1 million scooters!



Karaoke seems to be the national pastime enjoyed by all! We listened to and participated in Karaoke at Welcome Parties, Farewell Parties, and on the bus in between. The use of chopsticks is, of course, the norm and we got more proficient as the weeks passed.

When eating as a group in most restaurants and in some homes, the table is round and features a turntable whereupon numerous dishes are placed mostly vegetables, rice



and fish, concluding with soup and fresh fruit. The food in Taichung and Kaohsiung was different but the hospitality and friendliness of the host clubs was the same - outstanding. Some home hosts had limited English while others were able to communicate quite well.

The program in Taichung included an overnight visit to Sun Moon Lake staying at a lakeside hotel, a cruise of the lake, visits to an Art Center, an Aboriginal Center complete with traditional dance performances and a mini train ride around the beautiful gardens with trees in bloom, visits to 2 high schools, a private nursing



home, a

visits to a National Park, a Marine Biology Aquarium, the oldest city in Taiwan and the Buddha Memorial Hall. Even though we were kept busy with activities, there was ample host family time during both Exchanges. It was great to get to know some members of other Canadian Clubs and to make new friends in Taiwan, as well as to experience the beauty and customs of 2 different regions of Taiwan. Fourteen of us then enjoyed a 9 day bus tour of Vietnam, travelling from Ho Chi Minh City to Hanoi, which included a cruise along the Mekong Delta and an overnight cruise at Halong Bay. All in all, our Asian experience was a wonderful one!
