World Friendship Day

We celebrated World Friendship Day with the FF Manitoba Club on March 2, Wednesday at the Masonic Temple. Food was great and our club was responsible for the program. The presentation by Jill Hyatt of Canada Border Services (CBS) was extremely informative. In their job, CBS has to deal with the administration of over 90 Acts regarding security and immigration.

Jill stressed some very important things when travelling: a) Fill out the second page of your passport – next of kin, address, telephone no. etc. Add your e-mail and cell phone. In the event that you lose your passport at the airport, you can be contacted immediately by the finder or Security can send it back to you.

- b) Fill out the declaration card accurately when in doubt leave a question blank and ask CBS for help in answering the question. If you don't declare something and you are searched, it does not look good on your record for next time. Better to ask questions if in doubt as to what to claim.
- **c)** You buy a rug, coat, art and get it sent home, it is still part of your personal exemption and should be recorded on your declaration form as goods to follow.
- **d)** Go to: travel.gc.ca pick the country you wish to travel to and the web site gives you info on getting a visa, safety numbers, closest consulate, etc.
- **e)** Check your passport you need 6 months validity on it before travelling out of Canada. Apply for a new one if you have less than 6 months left on it.
- **f)** If you travel with grandkids, always fill out a form and have a letter from their parents saying you have permission to take the children out of the country.
- g) Nexus Card for \$50 for 5 years, you can apply for a Nexus card which allows you to pass through security via the shorter Nexus line. Go online, download the application, wait about 4 weeks. If you get accepted, you will then be asked to go for an interview. The Nexus card is for the honest citizen who knows and follows all the rules involved when travelling does not bring back illegal cigarettes, no extra drink, no illegal skins or shells, no illegal plant or animal products, etc. You follow ALL the rules. Then the Nexus card will fast track you through security and past those long lines of people.
- h) Declaring Food declaring you have food is legal and in most cases you might be allowed to bring food back to Canada. However, in stating you have food, then security may just wish to look at it to make sure it is legal. Apples no. Oranges and grapefruit yes. Poultry no. If you don't declare, it's worse. If you declare and they have to throw it out, it's OK. You are not a criminal. i) Go to AIRS on the internet, to check out what food is legal & illegal.

AND DON'T FORGET TO:

Make a copy of your passport, visa card, bank card, health & travel insurance, family contacts and keep in a safe place away from originals. If you lose your documents, you have a ready copy for cancelling cards and reissuing a new temporary passport.
